- Availability of daily case consultation through email or phone call with a child psychiatrist, psychologist, program coordinators: Mondays–Fridays 8 a.m.–5 p.m., excluding holidays
- Mental health education for primary care providers:
 - Rating Scales and Suicidality
 - Trauma Informed Care (TIC)
 - Psychopharmacology management of ADHD, depression and anxiety, and atypical antipsychotic agents
 - Behavioral management series forthcoming
- Ensure a referral support system for pediatric patients to other mental health professionals and community resources


BY THE NUMBERS...

 - 3 providers representing 1 clinic enrolled in the Northeastern Region


Our team has provided 1870 consultations through a combination of phone calls, emails, and letters/faxes.



REASONS PCPs CONTACTED CPCP
