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






Refugees and Asylee's: Who are They?

- In 2014, Wisconsin resettled 1,132 refugees, mostly from Burma, Iraq, or Somalia (Office of Refugee Resettlement, 2015)Recent countries of origin?
- Where do they settle? Mainly SE Wisconsin, & Dane County











So What?

So What?

- Suffer disproportionately
- High levels of trauma

We don't know how to ask about trauma

- 2003 Latino Primary Care Patients in
 - 54% had experienced politically violence 8% personally suffered torture
- Twice as likely to be Depressed • Twice as likely to be suffering from
- PTSD
- 3% ever told doctor

0% ever were asked by doctor.

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- 2003 Latino Primary Care Patients in LA
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 - 2008 Iraqi refugees in Salt Lake, Utah
 55% adults tortured (primary or secondary)
 7% of children tortured

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














Pre-Departure Screening Forms (or lack thereof)
